



Sergei O. Prokofieff (1954–2014) was one of the foremost researchers, authors and lecturers within the spiritual movement founded by Rudolf Steiner. A prolific writer of profound and illuminating works on anthroposophy, Prokofieff's legacy continues to inspire and guide readers around the world.

Johannes Mayer Lord Stanhope

The Adversary of Kaspar Hauser

Philip Henry, 4th Earl Stanhope, was considered by his contemporaries one of the most enigmatic figures surrounding the mystery of Kaspar Hauser.


An English aristocrat who assumed the role of Hauser's foster father, Stanhope presented himself as a benevolent philanthropist concerned solely with the young man's welfare. Hauser – who appeared on the streets of Nuremberg at the age of sixteen, claiming to have been raised in total isolation – was hailed as a symbol of 'natural innocence' and dubbed 'the Child of Europe'. But five years later, he was dead from a stab wound to the chest. Though whispers of Stanhope's involvement in the tragedy have persisted, they have never been definitively proven – until now.

In this groundbreaking and only major biography of Stanhope, Johannes Mayer uncovers the true and disturbing nature of the nobleman's relationship with the mysterious youth. Far from being a caring patron, Stanhope was a British intelligence agent trained for a career in European political espionage. Groomed by powerful allies and fluent in German, Stanhope was strategically positioned to observe – and ultimately neutralize – Hauser. His mission: win Hauser's trust, make him dependent, and then discredit and abandon him, setting the stage for his downfall.

Drawing on extensive primary sources – including letters, official documents and newly revealed material – Mayer paints a gripping portrait of deception and betrayal. Featuring dozens of photographs and illustrations, this riveting account follows a trail of intrigue from Great Britain and Sicily to the courts of Germany and Austria. At the heart of the story stands Kaspar Hauser: a tragic, sacrificial figure in the spiritual history of modern humanity.

JOHANNES MAYER (1933–2023) led Verlag Urachhaus from 1965 until its 1996 merger with Verlag Freies Geistesleben, after which he founded Johannes Mayer Verlag, directing it until 2013. He published influential works on religion, philosophy and art while dedicating himself to research on Kaspar Hauser. With Peter Tradowsky, he compiled a major 1984 compendium, later expanding his studies in the Stanhope archives, culminating in his landmark volume published in German in 1988.







Steiner outlines a path toward the reunion of that ancient trinity: science (truth), art (beauty), and religion (goodness). It was in the womb of the ancient mysteries – where knowledge was not only a matter for the mind but was carried over into religious rites - that the arts had their origin. In the ancient world, knowledge became lived artistic experience and religious deed. Modern humanity must once again give wings to knowledge if we are to find our way out of our world crisis – a crisis which is, at its core, a crisis of the soul.

Rudolf Steiner Earthly and Cosmic Man

These Berlin lectures, given by Rudolf Steiner to members of the Anthroposophical Society, open wide vistas onto primordial cosmic events and the distant epochs of human antiquity - ages that, though remote, cast a clarifying light upon our own. Despite pauses and interruptions, Steiner spoke with a rhythmic constancy in the city that served as his home amid years of ceaseless travel. His aim was to awaken at least a small circle of listeners to the urgent tasks of the time, to kindle within them a living awareness of the profound significance of the age in which humanity now stands.


His words bore the weight of destiny. Steiner spoke with the voice of an awakened human conscience. interweaving spiritual insight with details drawn from many spheres of knowledge. Humanity in its

immaturity could not fully comprehend such a voice, yet the attempt remained vital: some light had to be carried into the prevailing chaos, even if it could reach only a handful of receptive yet unformed souls. At times he sought to apply this inspiration directly to practical life. Inevitably, those who considered themselves 'practical' resisted such efforts with dismissal and even sabotage, judging his vision as remote from the realities they cherished.

Still, Steiner held firmly to the conviction that living thought cannot be extinguished. Rejected outwardly, it endures inwardly – transforming, reappearing, and working on in new forms. Its task is to persist tirelessly, even where outward success seems impossible. In its purity, it must seek out receptive souls – souls tested by experience and prepared, through trial, to open themselves to its transformative force.








Rudolf Steiner Introductions to Eurythmy

An Extension of Goethe's Morphological Thinking within the Realm of Human Movement

This volume features introductory addresses given by Rudolf Steiner to the first audiences of the newly crafted art of eurythmy. Before each eurythmy performance, Steiner gave such an introduction. His intention, as he remarked on several occasions, was not to elucidate the meaning of eurythmy intellectually - a vain and inartistic endeavour but rather to orient the audience to this new undertaking in the realm of art. Steiner took many approaches to this end, describing in his introductions a range of themes, from the origins of eurythmy as a Goethean art form to its role in pedagogy and therapy. As this volume gathers a large collection of these introductions, repetition is inevitable but not without value. A slight nuance of expression can awaken new insight.
